# Use Audacity...

- When you are recording longer audio files
- When you want production tools such as fade in, fade out, background music
- When you want to be able to edit the audio content
- To record content that you will use over and over

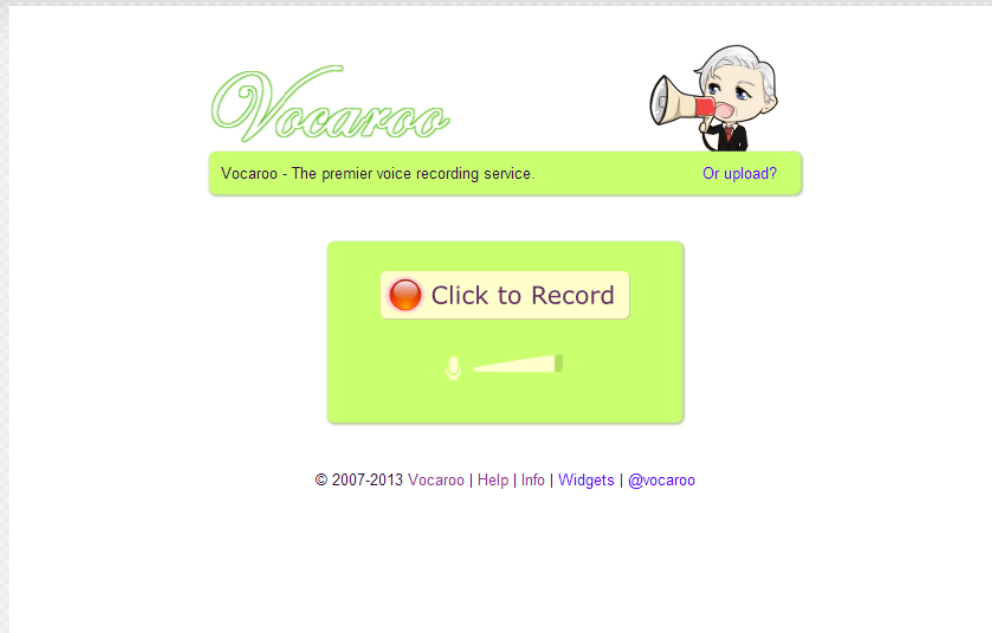
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# Use the Bb Audio Mashup...

- When you want to move quickly
- When you are recording short (< 5 min.) recordings
- For one time use only projects (e.g. announcements for a specific class)

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# Use Vocaroo...

- When you can't install software
- When you need to link to the audio
- For quick recordings outside of Blackboard
- To save file to edit in Audacity

# Tips/General Advice

- Keep recording short: less than 15 min. (10 is better!)
- Break up longer lectures into sections with labels so that students can easily go back to listen to the content they want



# Tips/General Advice

- Before recording, make a script of what you will say. Edit the script with any changes and make it available with the recording for accessibility.
